

## Sunday's Gospel Reflection John 4:5-42

*Jesus meets the Samaritan woman at the well*

### **HISTORICAL CONTEXT**

#### **Jews and Samaritans**

Samaritans descended from one of the tribes of Israel. They held faithful to Mt Gerazim as the first place for the worship of God even when the prophet Elijah declared a new place for worship. In the 7th and 8th Centuries BCE, the Assyrians descended on the Northern and Southern Kingdoms of Israel. The Samaritans in the north assimilated with the Assyrians, whilst the Jews were taken into exile in Babylon. When the Jews returned from exile, the Samaritans offered to assist in the reconstruction of the Temple. This infuriated the Jews and led to centuries of distrust and animosity.

### **LIVING THE GOSPEL**

#### **Personal encounter**

The Samaritan woman's personal encounter with Jesus compels her to start spreading the good news about the amazing man she has met. She meets Jesus face to face and feels compelled to act on what she has felt. Lent is a time for each of us to again – or for the first time – seek out a face to face encounter with Jesus. Through prayer, contemplation on scripture or reflection on encountering Jesus in the face of others, we build a one to one relationship with Jesus. When we acknowledge this relationship, like the Samaritan woman, we are compelled to act on it.

### **GOSPEL FOCUS**

#### **Transformation**

*The woman has obviously come to the well to draw water for herself. Her encounter with Jesus is a moment of transformation for her. At first, she fails to comprehend his reference to 'living water' and never being thirsty again. However, in the end "the woman put down her water jar and hurried back to the town." Leaving her water jar behind was a sign of the transformation that had taken place within her. She had indeed drunk of the living water of Jesus and no longer paid attention to the need for water that had brought her to the well.*

#### **Prayer**

Loving God, you know the desires that well up within our hearts and how we can betray them with narrowness and selfishness.

Send us your Spirit to nurture our hearts into the ways of loving that Jesus offered. May our longings dig deep into the soil of your love and may our lives witness to the richness of your life.

We ask this in Jesus' name confident that you will hear us.

Amen.

**Third Week of Lent**

*(School week beginning 16<sup>th</sup> March)*



Project Compassion, Week 3, brings you the story of Barry, a Gamilaroi man originally from western NSW. Barry is a father of four and he embodies resilience and strength. Growing up in a tough environment, he had to look inside himself to make the right choices for himself and his family.

Barry, and others like him, were able to take part in a cultural healing program called Red Dust Healing. This program encourages participants to examine their own personal hurt and allows them to heal from within, addressing family and personal relationships and what may have been life-long patterns of violence, abuse and neglect.

# ACROSS THE Curriculum



## NAPLAN 2020

A compulsory, nationwide practice test is part of the routines of NAPLAN administration. Most of the nation will sit their practice test on **Tuesday March 24th**. We have decided to take advantage of the window of time for scheduling this test. **The St Anne's practice test has been scheduled for Tuesday, 24th March, 2020. This practice test is simply to check the school's internet capacity, and student data is not collected at this time.**

While participation by all Saint Anne's students in Year 3 and Year 5 is expected, there are some instances where students may be withdrawn from one or more of the NAPLAN tests. This is a matter for consideration by individual parents and carers. Withdrawals are intended to address issues such as philosophical objections to testing.

**Should you wish to withdraw your child from the NAPLAN testing process, the principal, prior to the testing period, must receive a formal application. This paperwork is available from the front office if withdrawal is being considered for your child/ren. It is possible for students to sit the practice test, but be withdrawn from the official testing process.**

## What's Happening In Spelling?

This year, we have implemented professional learning communities, for our teaching staff, at St Anne's. A professional learning community (PLC) in schools involves collaboration, sharing and ongoing critical interrogation of teaching practices in line with our professional standards. Our NAPLAN data is showing us that spelling is an area we need to improve on across the whole school, so spelling has become a major curriculum focus for 2020/2021, and therefore for our professional learning communities.

There are many positive reasons for schools to run a professional learning community. PLCs are learning-oriented and promote the growth of teachers and students. They are effective in ensuring that school-wide teaching changes are sustainable. They help develop teachers' confidence and professional learning. Students achieve at higher levels in schools with positive PLCs. PLCs encourage and build effective leadership and management. When teachers across a school implement the same learnings and strategies, they create a consistent learning experience for students.

Our professional learning groups are organised with our P-3 teachers, and our 4-6 teaching staff. Once a month, we come together in these groups to discuss spelling, with how we teach spelling effectively as a team across our year levels as the major topic of discussion. In this space, teachers have time to read new and up to date research on the teaching of spelling and to plan a short unit on spelling using this up to date information. The unit of planning is also based on the data that teachers have collected over the term on the spelling needs of the students in our class.

Our next PLC is being scheduled in the coming weeks. I look forward to bring you further updates in this area!



