# FROM THE Principal



**THE IMPACT OF 1%ERS IN OUR SCHOOL? |** For improvement to occur, organisations such as schools must continue to review and refine practices. What worked well yesterday may not be the best solution today. We have learnt this from our recent dealings with COVID-19 and its impacts. Yesterday, you were sent an email asking you to complete a School Satisfaction Survey. This survey will allow us to collect data about our school - aspects we are doing well at and areas we need to further enhance and develop. The following article from Steve Francis is about improvement.

*In 2010 Dave Brailsford was appointed General Manager and Performance Director for Team Sky, a professional cycling team. Brailsford was confronted with a huge task. No British cyclist had ever won the Tour de France, but it was Brailsford's job to change that. Brailsford had a concept he referred to as the "aggregation of marginal gains". He explained it as "the 1 percent margin for improvement in everything you do". His approach was that if you improved every area related to cycling by just 1 percent, then those small gains would add up to remarkable improvement. But it was a lot more than just the obvious: the nutrition of riders, training programs, equipment etc.*

*They searched for the 1% improvements in the areas others had not thought about:*

- *the pillow that offered the best sleep*
- *the most effective type of massage gel*
- *teaching riders the best ways to wash their hands to avoid infection.*

*He believed that this focus on the 1% improvements would put them in the position to win the Tour de France in 5 years. **They won it in three years.** Sir Bradley Wiggins became the first British cyclist to win in 2012. Then they did it again in 2013 with Chris Froome. In 2012 Brailsford coached the British cycling team at the Olympics. They dominated the competition by winning 70% of the gold medals available.*

Let's consider this approach for our school. As parents what can we improve by just 1%?

- 1% increase in parents reading to their children at home or following up on assignments.
- 1% increase in parents reading the newsletter or volunteering.
- 1% less students arriving late to school or leaving early.
- 1% increase in parents' support of classroom activities.

I invite you to follow Brailsford's lead and take a moment to reflect upon aspects of your own lives that may benefit from the 1% principle.

MYPCorp have undertaken the following process to ensure anonymity:

1. Parents and guardians have been emailed **individual** survey logins.
2. Results will be collated externally.
3. A summary of collated results **ONLY** will be provided to the school leadership team.

**Yesterday you should have received survey instructions and a personalised login link via email. You will continue to be sent friendly reminders during the survey period until you have submitted the survey. This was indicated to you in an email sent out last week.**

**If you did not receive your survey instructions yesterday, please check your spam and junk email folders before contacting the school.**

**While we strongly encourage you to participate, the survey is not compulsory. If you decide that you do not want to complete the survey, simply click 'Unsubscribe' in the instruction or reminder email.**




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

# Finance NEWS

## Term 2 School Fees Are Due 16th June

To assist families, the normal 2 week due date has been extended to 16th June.

For those with an eligible government health concession card, the automatic discount on the tuition fee component of Term 2 school fees will increase from 70% to 100%. (**Please note:** All other levies, such as Building Fund Levy and Technology Levy, will still apply).

Two new concession card categories will also be eligible for the 100% tuition fee discount for Term 2 - the Job Seeker Payment (JSP) and the Farm Household allowance (FH).

**We ask that you please present your concession card or Centrelink digital evidence to the school office as soon as possible, so that records can be updated.**

Families without a concession card but who are experiencing financial stress as a result of the coronavirus are encouraged to contact Mr Oches. These discussions will be strictly confidential and respectful. A simplified concession application form is available.



## The Story

In Sunday's Gospel John speaks of God's great immeasurable love and the saving action of Jesus. Jesus explains to a man called Nicodemus that out of God's great love for the world God gave Jesus to us.



## The Scriptures

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to **John 3:16-17**

Jesus told Nicodemus:

"God loved the people of this world so much  
that he gave his only Son,  
so that everyone who has faith in him  
will have eternal life and never die.

God did not send his Son into the world to condemn its people.  
He sent him to save them!"

## Family Discussion

Trinity is a word that means 'made up of three', and we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity that honours our understanding of three persons in one God. Who are the three persons that make up the Trinity?

Whenever we make the Sign of the Cross, we are remembering that we believe in the Holy Trinity: one God who is three Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. At their Baptism, Christians are baptised in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Have a look at photos or videos from family baptisms. Make the sign of the cross on each other's forehead to remember your Baptism.

## Family Activity

Traditionally St Patrick was said to use the shamrock (three-leaf clover) to explain the Trinity as God who is three in one. Go for a walk or drive to your local park and go on a shamrock hunt. When you have found some, talk about how it is through the Trinity – the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit – that we come to know God.
