## CLASS OF THE WEEK PREP V

Prep have loved getting in to working our muscles that help us to learn. The two programs we have had on the go this term are PMP and Fingergym.

PMP - The Perceptual Motor Program operates in our Prep, 3 times a week, as a strategy to assist the development of children's gross motor skills and therefore assists with the development of fine motor skills, essential in the learning of reading and writing.

This program assists the development of the child and their relationship with their peers and the surrounding environment. It aids concentration and reasoning and gives a sound basis for future formal learning. PMP enhances brain development by stimulating the senses through movement.

Fingergym - this is a program that uses fun and motivating fine motor-based activities to help students become more independent in the classroom. Developed by experienced occupational therapy and education professionals, this program incorporates strengthening muscles in their core, shoulders and arms through to hands and fingers.



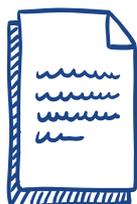



# Finance NEWS

**TERM TWO FEES** | Term 2 Fees are now overdue. Thank you to those families who have already made payments. Please feel free to contact the school to discuss other arrangements.

Families without a concession card but who are experiencing financial stress as a result of the coronavirus are encouraged to contact Mr Oches. These discussions will be strictly confidential and respectful. A simplified concession application form is available.

**CONCESSION CARDS** | For those with an eligible government health concession card, the automatic discount on the tuition fee component of Term 2 school fees will increase from 70% to 100%. (**Please note:** All other levies, such as Building Fund Levy and Technology Levy, will still apply).

Two new concession card categories will also be eligible for the 100% tuition fee discount for Term 2 - the Job Seeker Payment (JSP) and the Farm Household allowance (FH).

**We ask that you please present your concession card or Email Centrelink digital evidence to the school office as soon as possible, so that records can be updated.**

## Something to Think About

What makes you feel scared? Jesus tells us that we don't need to be afraid because God is always watching over us. God cares for us through the people who love us the most and who help us to overcome our fears and anxieties. You might like to take turns composing "Don't be afraid to..." statements.

## The Story

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus continues to prepare his disciples to go and spread the Good News to those who have not heard it. Jesus tells them, "**Do not be afraid of anyone!**" This phrase (or similar words) occurs 366 times in the Bible. Clearly, it is a message Jesus wants us to hear and observe.

## The Scriptures

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to **Matthew 10:26-27, 29-31**

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Don't be afraid of anyone!

Everything that is hidden will be found out, and every secret will be known.

"Whatever I say to you in the dark, you must tell in the light.

And you must announce from the housetops  
whatever I have whispered to you.

"Aren't two sparrows sold for only a penny?

But your Father knows when any one of them falls to the ground.

Even the hairs on your head are counted.

So don't be afraid! You are worth much more than many sparrows."

The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

## Family Discussion

As a family, talk about something you know about each other that maybe no one else knows. Jesus tells us that God knows and loves us even more than anyone in our family. How does that make you feel? Chat about who you talk to if you are worried about doing something new. Remember that we can talk to God (pray) if we feel frightened or alone.

## Family Activity

You will need pieces of paper for each person, pens, and a basket. Gather the family together - it could be around the table, in a circle on the floor or at a park. Each person writes or draws ways that they need God's help for themselves, or for the family, or for someone else. Collect the pieces of paper in the basket. Remembering that God knows and loves us, someone takes a slip of paper from the basket, reads it to the family, and then all pray together for that need, "**Loving God who knows and loves us, hear our prayer.**" You may choose to continue this as a meal or bedtime routine.
